Educate Together welcomes Patronage Forum

Educate Together has hailed the announcement by Ruairi Quinn, Minister for Education and Skills, of a National Forum on Patronage in Primary Education as a positive step for Irish education. The Forum will invite consultation from parents as well as patron bodies and other interested stakeholders.

Commenting on the Minister's announcement Paul Rowe Educate Together CEO said 'We congratulate the Minister for taking this step. This is a long-overdue initiative which we hope will accelerate the process of meeting the needs of parents seeking Educate Together schools. We wish the new expert group every success in their work and look forward to positively contributing to the process'.

Educate Together currently has 70 applications to open primary schools nationwide lodged with the Department. Paul Rowe again 'The importance of this new process and its urgency cannot be understated.

Increased diversity in primary school choice has been a long-standing issue in Irish education. Over the past three years, the previous administration held back the progress of recognition of new Educate Together schools and refused to hold a national forum on patronage. We currently have 20 priority applications ready to go, some of which could open in September if given the goahead.

We are seeing increasing numbers of school start up groups in areas where the Department of Education is resistant to opening up new schools. In most cases, this is because of the existence of vacant educational space. This creates a real problem for parents who cannot access the type of education they want in the area where they live. All school patrons are aware of this issue and are seeking constructive solutions. I hope the National Forum will facilitate and help progress the positive initiatives already underway and help deliver a primary education system that truly

reflects the rights of all parents and children.'

Submission to the U.N.

Educate Together has submitted a report to the United Nations Human Rights Council in relation to Ireland's Universal Periodic Review (UPR) that is to take place in October this year. This work maintains the profile of the case successfully taken by Educate Together to the UN International Convention for the Elimination of Racial Discrimination (CERD) in 2005 in relation to Irish families having access to multi-denominational schools. This case is made under the provisions for the right of freedom of expression and also access to education. It is anticipated that the Universal Periodic Review process in October will again re-iterate a recommendation to the Irish state to increase the number of such schools.

National Children's Strategy Consultation week

As you may well be aware the Department of Children and Youth Affairs, under new Minister Frances Fitzgerald, is kicking off the National Children's Strategy with a school's consultation process. They have mailed every school in the country with a questionnaire that is aimed at 8-12 year olds at Primary Level. The questionnaire contains questions about what's good, what's not so good and what they would change about being a child or young person in Ireland today. these questions were developed by children and young people themselves. he aim is to get to know the issues of real importance to children and young people all over the country to feed into the new strategy. The Department is working with a research team in Trinity College who will collate the results and publish them.

Educate Together welcomes this initiative as it gives our children a real opportunity to contribute to the development of government policy that will directly affect them. We hope you all get involved and Educate Together National Office would be very interested in the insights your students have.

National Gifted Education Awareness Day

This Friday, April 8th is National Gifted Education Awareness Day (NGEAD), promoting awareness among teachers of the presence of Exceptionally Able children in Irish schools and to develop their awareness of the challenges and myths surrounding Exceptionally Able children. The next day is the first EU Talent Day, a day used to celebrate all talent; sporting, music and artistic. NGEAD will involve a posting to every school of a poster and a brochure of information. The Lidl Fit Factor is run in conjunction with the Irish Heart Foundation and promotes healthy eating and physical activity.



Redeployment Panel Information

The Department of Education and Skills have sent on the list of teachers on the Educate Together Main Redeployment Panel. Contrary to the much larger numbers being expected there are only 4 teachers listed. There may be additional teachers added at a later date.

There are currently 52 Permanent vacancies in the Educate Together network. When further posts are sanctioned (either permanent or fixed term) schools have 5 days to inform the panel operator (Louise Daly) of these posts.

The contact details of teachers on the panel have been sent to schools. The DES have not indicated when they will be releasing the Supplementary Panel.

SNA Appointment Changes

Circular 0021/2011- Educational Qualifications for Appointment as Special Needs Assistant in Recognised Primary and Post Primary Schools

The minimum educational requirements for the appointment of Special Needs Assistants (SNAs) have been amended. With effect from September 2011 the minimum required standard of education for appointment to the post of SNA is:

- A Fetac level 3 major qualification on the National Framework of Qualifications OR
- 2. A minimum of three grade Ds in the Junior Certificate, OR
- 3. Equivalent.

Any questions regarding the level of learning or recognition of qualifications should be addressed to the National Qualifications Authority of Ireland at www.nfg.ie.

Schools must still comply with other employment criteria as outlined in Circular 03/03.

All SNAs who meet the amended requirements will now progress on the incremental scale for SNAs from 1st September 2011. Schools should inform the DES that current SNAs meet the requirements before September so that their salary will reflect the increment. The previous educational requirements for SNAs was a grade D in Irish, English and Maths in the Junior Certificate or the Day Vocational Certificate Examination or in an examination of equivalent standard. The new requirements make it easier for candidates who may not have been educated in Ireland.

EAL SUPPORT

The application form for EAL support is now available on the Department of Education website. For those who are having trouble finding it (and it is difficult to find!) the following directions might help.

On the homepage click on 'Educational Personnel" on the top bar. Then click on 'Primary' in the left margin. Then click on 'Teacher Allocations'. It is currently the first form available year along with the Circular 15/2009 which is relevant also.

ASSESSMENT OF NEED

Circular 00/20- The Assessment of Need process under the Disability Act 2005

Under the provisions of part 2 of the Disability Act 2005 parents may apply for an assessment of need if they are of the opinion that their child may have a disability as defined in the Act. This Circular outlines the process involved in gaining an assessment of need for child who is under the age of five. The process is initiated by the parents or guardians in all cases. If a child presents as having learning, behavioural, emotional or social difficulties in school and hasn't already been assessed the principal could inform the parents of the assessment of need process. Assessment Officers will carry out the assessments and sometimes will also be in contact with the relevant SENO who will be able to inform them of the educational services which will be available to the child. When a child has been assessed as having high incidence special needs as set out in DES Circular 02/05 schools should support the child through the General Allocation Model. If it is evident from the reports supplied/ assessment of need process that the child meets the criteria for additional resources under the DES criteria for low incidence need, the principal may make an application to the SENO in the normal way.

SCHOOL BOOKS

Circular 0023/2011-Allocations to schools for books

The DES expects payments to be made to schools in April to provide assistance for books. The DES will be urging schools to put in place book rental schemes as these are the most effective means of lowering costs for all parents. The additional funding per capita will be:

- Allocation to DEIS schools for books: €21
- Allocation to non DEIS schools for books €11

Employment Assistance Service

Employee Assistance Service is extended to Retirees for up to 6 months following Retirement

The Employee Assistance Service (EAS) is a free and confidential counselling and support service for teachers, Special Needs Assistants (SNAs) and their family members to provide them with assistance in coping with a variety of issues. The service has recently been extended to include access for retired teachers and SNAs for up to six months following retirement. Teachers/SNAs may experience a mix of emotions when retiring and having access to the EAS during the weeks and months following retirement will help with the adjustment.

What kind of services are available?

- Telephone Counselling single sessions or short term structured counselling
- Face to Face counselling up to six counselling sessions

Counselling is provided on issues such as health, relationships, addictions, bereavement, stress, conflict, critical incident and trauma.

Re-imagining Learning

Given Educate Together's status as a Second level patron and current calls for change at second-level that are coming from across the educational and political spectrum Educate Together is hosting a conference entitled "Re-imagining learning: Curriculum integration in the early secondary years. In partnership with the NCCA and the University of Limerick, the two-day conference is taking place at the Limerick Strand Hotel on May 13th and 14th.

Emer Nowlan, Educate Together's Head of Education and Network Development says "The time for reform and innovation in Irish education is now. The need to improve second-level schooling, in particular, is widely accepted by business leaders, educationalists and social activists. The only question that remains is how. Most commentators agree on the broad direction in which the system needs to move: a more relevant, applied and integrated curriculum, a more learner-centred approach, greater emphasis on critical thinking, communicating and other 21st century skills and, crucially, integrating ICT into the educational process at every level."
