## Second-level Easter Camp Report

Wednesday 27 - Friday 29 April

Our very first second-level [Easter Camp](#) took place during the Easter school holidays (27, 28 and 29 April). This was a partnership initiative with [Bridge 2 College](#) (now Bridge 21) and took place at their Learning Space at Oriel House, Trinity College.

A total of 18 students participated in the project, the majority of whom came from Educate Together primary schools and were either 6th Class students or in 1st Year at second-level. The students worked in teams on a theme-based, technology-mediated project that aimed to integrate selected subjects from the Junior Cycle curriculum, with an emphasis on developing students' Key Skills.

We were delighted with the way the students worked so well together, especially as they came from different schools and didn't know each other at the start of the camp. Feedback from the students was overwhelmingly positive, with all of them reporting that as well as learning new skills, they also had fun!

Preliminary results from the Easter Camp will be presented at the *Re-imagining Learning* conference in May.
