Early Intervention and Autism Class Application and Decision Dates for admission to the 2026/2027 school year

Mullingar Educate Together National School, with the approval of the Minister for Education, has established 1 Early Intervention Preschool and 4 classes to provide an education exclusively for autistic students.

Children and young people are eligible for enrolment in a special class for autistic students when the following is provided in support of such an application:

Professional report(s) outlining:

• Diagnosis of special educational needs (e.g. Autism: DSM IV/V or ICD 10/11 (psychologist, psychiatrist, multi-disciplinary report)

AND

 A demonstration of the understanding of complexity of the child's overall level of need/s evidenced in the professional reports

AND

• Given the severity or complexity of the child's support needs, a clear professional recommendation as to what educational placement type would be most appropriate to best meet the child's needs, along with the rationale for same

AND

 A letter from the NCSE confirming that the child is known to them and that the child has the required diagnosis and recommendation for a special class for autistic students / students with autism.

<u>Circular 39/2025</u> advises parents/guardians seeking to enrol their child or young person in a special class or special school:

- that they should notify the NCSE by 1 October and engage with them on the range of options which are available to meet the needs of their child or young person and
- that parents/guardians should obtain a letter from the NCSE to submit with their admission application for a special class or special school confirming that the child meets the requirements for enrolment to that setting.
